Let’s show that Stoke Fleming really means business as a compassionate community, by learning more about the issues, by prayer and by giving generously through Christian Aid.

25th May is Rogation Sunday when we ask for God’s blessing on the work of farmers, gardeners and fishermen. If the weather is kind it is a wonderful chance to move out from church to field and garden, and back through the churchyard, thanking God for all he has given us in this beautiful location and praying for village and parish, for livestock and pets and wildlife. Please come and join in!

He helped set up the Short Mat Bowls Club as well as playing outdoor bowls and, with his son Mark and grandson Joel, became a formidable team, known as the Jordan Triples and won many trophies and prizes.

80th anniversary of VE Day!

Dartmouth Town Council are hosting a Street Party in Royal Avenue Gardens on Sunday 11th May to honour this historic occasion, starting at midday with The Proclamation read by the Town Crier. They invite us to come dressed in 1940s attire, bring a picnic and enjoy great company as we commemorate the bravery and sacrifices made during WWII. There'll be music from the BRNC Volunteer Band and children's entertainment. Dartmouth Rotary are operating the bar, supported by Bays Brewery. Finishes at 4pm.

Across the country, including in Stoke Fleming, it is planned that church bells will ring at some time during the day, and at 9.30pm over 1,000 Beacons and Lamp Lights of Peace will be lit.

In Nick Teage's history of Stoke Fleming he tells us this about how the village responded to the end of the war in Europe. "The Allies accepted the surrender on 6th May 1945 which was celebrated as VE Day (Victory in Europe). £64 was collected and spent on a carnival fancy dress parade in the morning, children's tea and adult sports, a comic football match and a general tea in 3 sittings in the afternoon followed by a bonfire in Thorn Field, Mill Lane and a social in the evening. But the war in the Far East continued and it must have been quite difficult for people like my mother with loved ones still fighting there to join in the celebrations. It was not until the atom bombs were dropped over Hiroshima and Nagasaki that the Japanese finally surrendered on 15th August 1945, which would become known as VJ Day". *Our thanks to Nick for his permission to print this extract from his book.*

Get growing this May with Gardentime!

May's a busy month in the garden. Summer's just around the corner and everywhere you look, plants are flowering and bees are buzzing. When the sun shines, there is nothing better than a garden in May, so here are a few tips to get your garden looking its best.



May Gardening Jobs

- **Plant out summer bedding plants** like petunias, geraniums and marigolds for a splash of colour.
- **Get tender vegetables planted** such as tomatoes, courgettes and cucumbers—perfect for your grow-your-own patch!
- **Harden off young plants** raised indoors by gradually introducing them to outdoor conditions.
- **Give evergreen hedges and topiary a trim** to keep them neat and encourage strong growth.
- **Direct sow hardy annuals** like sunflowers and cornflowers straight into borders for easy summer blooms.
- **Stay vigilant for pests** such as aphids and slugs—early action now can save your plants later!
- **Feed roses** with a specialist fertiliser to encourage strong, healthy flowering.

Nature Notes

In spite of the easterly and northerly winds some of the summer birds arrived. The first, like before, is the chiffchaff which came on 4th April and it is common by the 7th April for most of the parish. The second is a willow warbler which arrived on 11th April near the dilapidated Venn Farm. The third and final arrival is a solitary swallow flying over Riversbridge Lane towards the Venn Stream. A pair of cirl buntings, or maybe two, was seen near Pine Wood near Ash Lane on 10th April onwards. Two herons were seen on 10th April, one at Riversbridge Pools and the other at Combe Pond, the latter flew to South Wood. The little grebe came out of the island after and dived to get some food. A Canada goose flew from the corner of Combe Pond to the middle of the pond and swam on the 13th. Also, I saw a peregrine falcon flying over Ash Lane to Stancombe Wood on the 10th. A pair of kestrels were seen, a female at Little Dartmouth on 4th April and a male at Cotton on 7th April. At 9 pm on my return on 13th April a Leisler's bat came over me and then went to go down Worden Track.

We are so lucky to live in an area where so much goes on. The Dartmouth Calendar is full of events throughout the year and this year is the 27th Dart Music Festival.

Three days of fabulous, live music spread across our 8 official venues in the town and this year, more restaurants and pubs than ever have stepped up to provide more music for our fabulous audiences to enjoy. See the website at www.dartmusicfestival.co.uk for a preview of the weekend's line-up.

DMF is a free-to-attend event, brought to you by a small team of volunteers, but it certainly isn't free to put on. Every year we commit to spend around £90,000 and then we try to raise that money.

Nearly half of that comes from our wonderful business sponsors and Festival Friends, but the rest is funded by programme sales and donations to our bucket-rattlers over the weekend.

A note for residents of Little Cotton:

DMF underwrites an extension to the Park and Ride service which will be operating an extended evening service over the weekend.

If you live at the top of Dartmouth, a ticket can be purchased from the Park and Ride machine or by using code 810442 on the Pay by Phone App. This provides a return bus journey for up to 6 people for £10.

Whilst DMF makes no money from this provision, if it makes a loss (as it did last year) then DMF has to meet that shortfall.

If you are planning on using the bus over the weekend, please consider using the Park and Ride to help keep this service viable.

Stoke Fleming Loam Rangers (SFLR)

The 2025 season has started with a real flourish – must be the wonderful weather combined with the enthusiastic gardeners of Stoke Fleming! We increased the number of compost bags members can take from three to five and everyone has certainly bought into that with a record 440 bags being taken in March.

Talking of records we had the 2024/5 AGM on Wednesday 9th April – thanks to all who attended. A few highlights from that meeting

1305 visits to site Apr 24 to Mar 25 – up 30% on previous year

1883 compost bags taken – up 38% (28,245 kg)

Drainage channel installed

News from Blackpool Sands

Blackpool Sands is celebrating a new boardwalk thanks to a grant to part-fund its cost. A grant of £8,091 was secured from Defra's "Access for All" funding to make the South Devon National Landscape more accessible for people of all ages and abilities. It is part of a wider government initiative to make all protected landscapes "places for everyone".



The boardwalk is made of almost 10 tonnes of recycled soft plastic waste such as crisp packets and bread bags; the kind that isn't easily recyclable at scale. This is then injected into moulds to form boardwalk sections which are linked together and placed on the beach to provide two pathways.

Now that the boardwalk has been laid people are taking full advantage of this easy access path to visit parts of the beach they were unable to reach in the past. A huge thank you to South Devon National Landscape for helping to make this happen and to The Plastic Company in Ivybridge for supplying and installing this boardwalk.

MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING OF THE PARISH COUNCIL ON WEDNESDAY 5th March 2025, AND PLANNING SITE MEETING NOTES

Were signed by the Chairman of the meeting as true and correct records.

DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST Cllr Moseley announced he will be standing down as Vice-Chairman from the next meeting. Council thanked Cllr Moseley for his excellent work as Vice-Chairman.

PUBLIC QUESTION TIME Baker Estates: a report regarding S73 Application to increase retail cap at Little Cotton for proposed 'Home Bargains' retail outlet. Planning authority can put condition on what sort of retail is permitted. 100 jobs are expected – some part time. It was noted that Norton bends are narrow for lorry access. No interest for the site has been received by builders' merchants. S106 monies Open Space and Recreation has been earmarked for playing fields at Norton, to broaden this out will require a Deed of Variation. Clerk's note: Baker Estates will be present at the Annual Parish Meeting on 7th May from 7pm.

COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

- Council tax bills have increased by 5%
- Devolution: Five options are being considered – feedback from Govt expected in April, costs of £100m expected if process is 'cliff edge'.

- Devolution: 451 proposal is supported by most district councils, local link may be under threat. Unitary may have too many councillors. 31 councillors are presently at South Hams. Parish councils are going to have to do more.
- Council tax and parking charges are now live..
- S106 Agreements – Deer Park. £21,000 improvements for Recreation Field noted, triggered by sale of individual properties 50% prior and 50% on occupation. Application should be made to SHDC for this funding. Clerk to add to Actions List. Clerk to request full details from Cllr Rake to confirm in detail.

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN Proposed new car park. Landowner is working with land agent who is concerned about commercial value of the field. Landowner keen on a

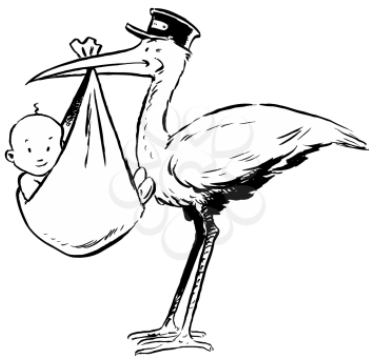

Prickles in a Pickle

My favourite time of year, new beginnings, new life, and nature waking up. The rain is very welcome, after such a long dry spell bringing us many severely dehydrated hedgehogs. Thank you for supporting our Easter coffee, cake and craft event; we raised £769.60. We have a lot more booked throughout the year including Yealmpton Show, South Devon Riviera Garden Festival at



Lupton House, a Celidh, a quiz night, bingo night and loads more. All this, plus the running of the charity, the work we do for the hedgehogs, all the talks, educating with the Devon Wildlife Trust in schools all over Devon, all adds up to a busy life.

We have had some amazing news. The Fisher Trust have agreed that anything we raise in the next 6 months for our new hospital fund up to £25,000, they will double in match funding. This will help tremendously.

People are still staggered to see how many hedgehogs we have here and the set up and equipment we have. We have 47 volunteers, 8 trustees and 25 volunteer drivers. We always need more hands. When you factor in holidays and illness we like to have a buffer zone. Especially when things get really busy.

We have got most of our winter hedgehogs out bar a few. Since January we have taken in 85, and we are nervously anticipating the sound of tiny pattering feet and peeping as the babies start arriving.

Our Duke of Edinburgh students are trooping through their bronze, silver and gold awards. We have now taken nearly 80! Weekends are a bit like a youth club at times! It's great to see them all blossom and thrive.

Speaking of thriving, friends of ours have been hand rearing 6 rabbit kits. A digger went through their burrow and there they were. Once weaned, they came to us to start rewilding and now they will be going to a soft release area that is being rewilded and has no rabbits. Surprisingly rabbits are on the decline in a lot of areas causing many other animals and raptors issues with finding food, as they are a vital part of the food chain. Some, reading this, will be thinking, "what a lot of rot, we have too many where we are". There are 'pockets' of them, but they are isolated due to habitat fragmentation, and cannot link up.

We need a washer upper for a couple of hours in the mornings, 9 -11 if you have a bit of time spare. We have our lovely Mary on a Thursday and Belinda on Mondays, but it would be very useful to have the other days covered as well.

South Hams do not operate any QR codes in their car parks, and they make daily checks of our machines and car park signs to look out for fake QR stickers.

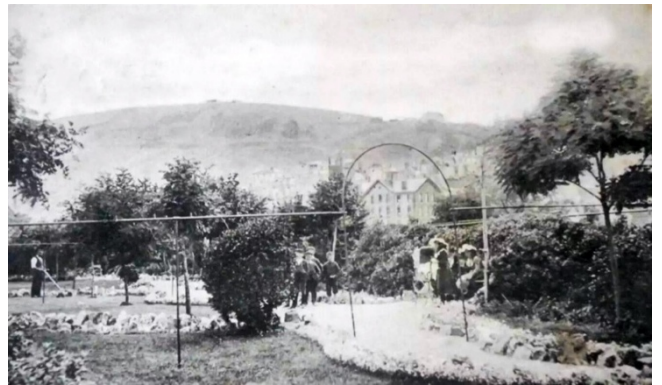
